

The Green Business Club had a standout year, reflecting the strong and growing commitment to sustainability of the Columbia Business School student body. This past year, our membership increased by 40%, reaching nearly 300 members. We planned dozens of events with top speakers from industry, academia, & policy, took two amazing treks to Colorado and the ClimateCAP MBA summit in Ann Arbor, got some *amazing* tote bags, and set a renewed focus on mentorship and our alumni community. At CBS, climate has continued to grow as an industry and academic focus. We now have over 5 faculty members with climate & sustainability-focused courses, and are increasingly engaging in partnerships across programs like the Climate School, SIPA & CGEP, and the LEAP Center. In particular, the Tamer Institute and faculty lead Bruce Usher are at the center of CBS climate initiatives - developing highly valuable experiential learning experiences like the Three Cairns Fellowship and Climate Knowledge Initiative, and hosting the annual Climate Business & Investment Conference. We are so excited to keep building a network of MBA students with climate expertise & commitment to sustainability-focused roles in all sectors of the economy!

Virtual Climate Finance Case Study: Generate Capital & Ambient Fuels Moderated by GBC VP Dan Ioselevich, this hands-on discussion featured voices from both sides of a climate VC investment in green hydrogen, including negotiation and determining culture fit.

This panel covered everything from IRA policy to scaling waste-to-energy business models.

climate tech & VC landscape - with CBS
Professor Gernot Wagner hosting leaders

LEARNING BY DOING



Career Panels with Alumni & Industry Partners like Climatebase

In both semesters, CBS alumni like Maneesh Sagar of RS Metrics & Kaitlin Butler of NY Green Bank spoke at panels on internships and full-time roles in sustainability. GBC also co-hosted a climate tech recruiting workshop with S2 Strategies, Nextwave Partners, & Climatebase.



LionTank Student Climate Startup Pitch Events

Throughout the year, GBC hosted two startup pitch events featuring climate-focused founders at CBS and in the NYC area. These pitches were judged by local investors and highlighted the increasing focus on climate in the New York tech & innovation ecosystem.



Pivotal180 Renewables Project Finance Modeling Bootcamp

Over 30 students attended a two-day hands-on training for solar & wind project finance modeling, with the same training platform used by major financial firms.





Climate Crash Courses on Climate Science & Power Sector

GBC VP Patrick Lin provided extensive crash courses on key climate topics, which have been linked with the training modules provided by the career center to new students, and will be expanded into a GBC mini-curriculum next fall.



Mentorship, 2nd-Year Panels, and Career AMAs

First and second-years continued to connect through mentorship pairs, hosting ask-me-anything conversations, internship panels, and thematic dinner pods on topics like Hydrogen, EVs, and Circular Economy.



Case Competitions & Three Cairns Fellowship

Nearly 30 GBC members were involved in the <u>Three Cairns Fellowship</u> this year, working with clients like Accelerate Impact Group, BlackRock, BNP Paribas, Closed Loop Partners, Deloitte, Energize Capital, GrowNYC, HASI, NYCHA, TECA, Tomorrow.io, and the World Economic Forum. In addition, a CBS team placed <u>third</u> in the Kellogg-Morgan Stanley Sustainable Investing Challenge.


